I am writing in support of the Community Arts & Heritage Education Project (CAHEP)'s application to launch a new, arts-education program at Sherbrooke school, and other schools in Thunder Bay. The initiative will offer a safe space for youth in our community to create, socialize and engage with professional artists, while building confidence and self-esteem.

Currently, CAHEP provides female-centered arts programming (Speak Up Program) to the grade 5/6 and grade 7/8 girls at Sherbrooke school. As part of a school district that serves students from many rural communities, including students from the far North, improving student engagement is a priority for us. As the principal at Sherbrooke school, I know, first hand, the ability of CAHEP's work to engage some of our hardest to reach students. Since taking part in Speak Up, there has been an overall improvement in the girls' attendance, in particular on the days when the programs take place.

In addition, there have been other improvements to the well-being of these girls such as:

- · increased leadership skills and self-esteem;
- increased coping skills (ability to overcome adversary)
- increase sense of belonging (because of the consistent nature of meeting together weekly);
- increased sense of agency (youth have a say in how programs are planned and delivered);
- increase sense of hope for the future (through new connections to arts opportunities available in the community)

We are eager to participate in this new proposal, which will allow all students at Sherbrooke to benefit from CAHEP's arts-education programs. Sherbrooke school is pleased to support this funding application and we look forward to being a part of this initiative.
